I like to <u>reward</u> students for their good work.


handsomely: To do something handsomely means to do it in a way that is great or more than you expected.

greedy: A greedy person wants a lot of something and does not want to share it.






The bird was greedy about the peanuts.


consequences: Consequences happen as the result of another action. If I walk on thin ice, the consequences might be that I fall through the ice.
