Bob and Bill both had an important duty in their homes.

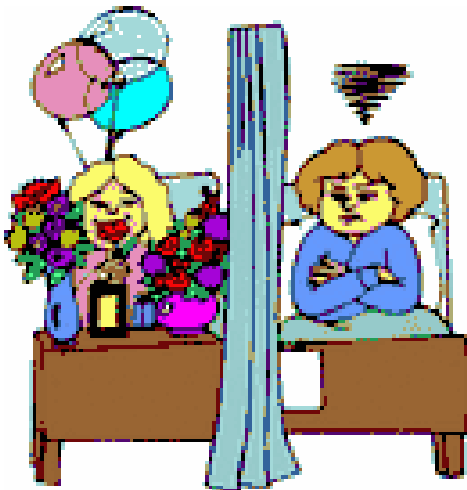


envy: When you feel envy, you want something that someone else has.
