babble: to say words that are not understood




Usually before babies speak words, they <u>babble</u>.

scent: A scent is what something smells like.




Would you prefer the <u>scent</u> from a skunk or a candle?


wanders: If someone wanders, that person travels without really knowing where he or she is going.

accompany: to go someplace with someone





Megan wanted her mother to <u>accompany</u> her to her new classroom.

competent: being good at what you do





Both men were <u>competent</u> at their public utility jobs.
