babble: to say words that are not understood



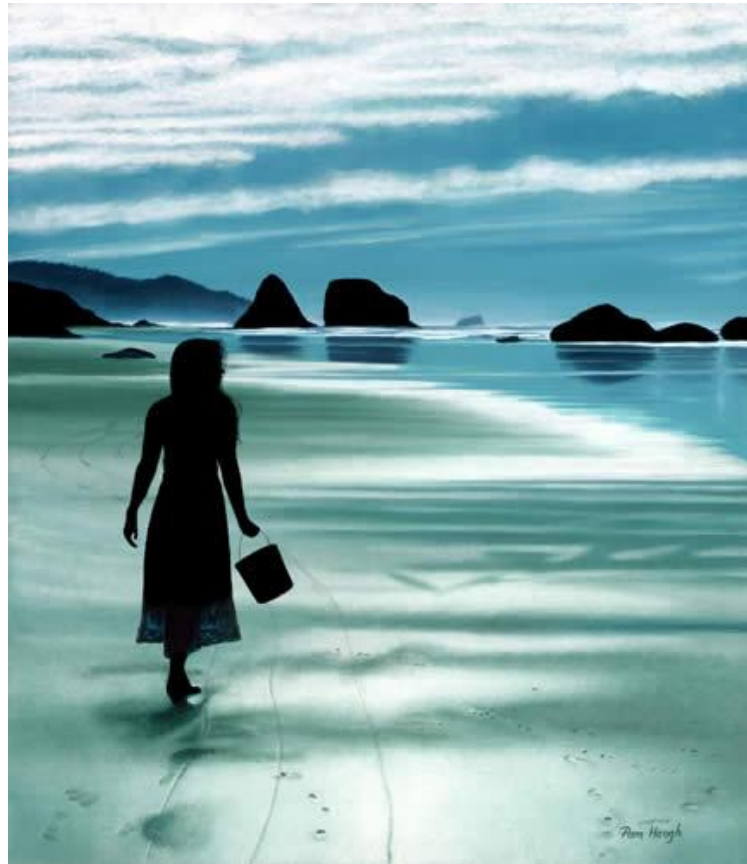
Usually before babies speak words, they babble.

scent: A scent is what something smells like.



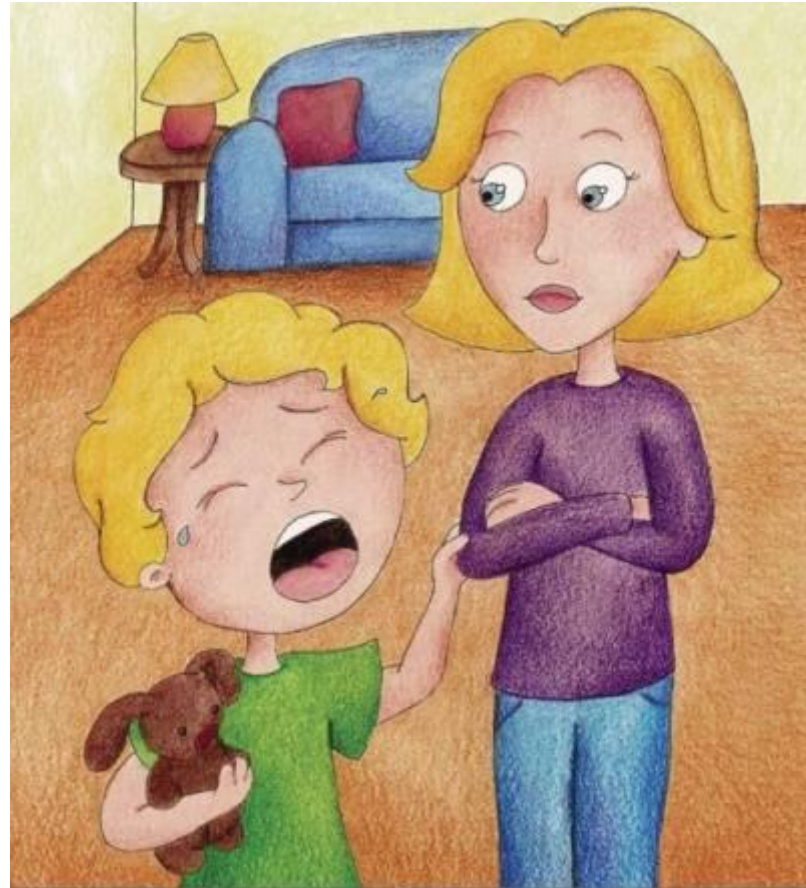
Would you prefer the scent from a skunk or a candle?

Gail wanders on the beach in search of some new seashells.

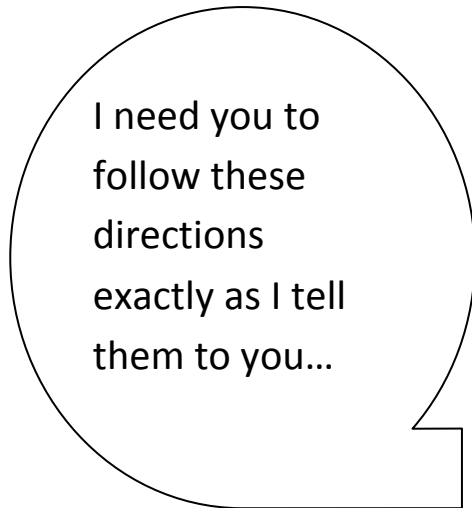
whined: If someone or something whined, it gave a long, high cry.
